 SUBJECT: Climate Advisory Workgroup Frontline Community Members Recommendation

Requested Action

Review Climate Advisory Workgroup (CAW) applications and appoint members for the frontline community member open slots.

Background

The Climate Advisory Workgroup will serve as the community stakeholder group supporting the Steering Committee in the implementation of local climate action. They will review the Annual Work Program, Annual Report, and other proposals under consideration by CASC. The group met for their first meeting on August 29th.

In June, the Steering Committee appointed four permanent members, eight term members, and one term alternate. Per the staff team’s recommendation, they left two slots open for frontline community members and one for someone with experience in agriculture, workforce development, or rural residence. In August, the Steering Committee appointed Linsey Fields to serve in the slot saved for agriculture, workforce development, or rural residence. Recruitment has continued with focus on finding BIPOC or low-income members, or members with disabilities. The workgroup’s current composition is below:

New Applicants

TRPC conducted outreach to frontline communities throughout August through the following methods:

- South Sound BIPOC Business Roundtable
- Thurston Climate Action Team Health & Equity Group
- Thurston County Racial Equity Committee
- St. Martins, South Puget Sound Community College, and the Evergreen State College
- Thurston County Food Bank

Seven applications were received. Summaries of recommended applicants are included below, and the full applications are attached.

Recommended Applicants

The Multijurisdictional Staff Team met on September 12th and reviewed the new applications. After a thorough review, the following candidates were recommended for the expertise and new perspectives they will bring to the group.

Tierra Bonds

Tierra has expertise in several areas that will be of benefit to the workgroup, including business development and affordable housing. Tierra works and volunteers with low-income communities and communities of color, and is well-suited for membership in the group in general and as a frontline community member.

Jasmin S. Miller

Jasmin is a student at St. Martin’s University that has experienced firsthand the impacts of poverty and other challenges on folks’ perspectives of and experiences with climate change. Jasmin has built relationships with communities of color, people of low-income, and people with disabilities and can help the workgroup understand how these different identities may impact residents’ needs and priorities related to climate action.

I have lived in Bellingham Washington where homelessness has become a growing issue over the years. From 2019 up until 2021 I was homeless with my grandma whom is disabled. During that time I was her sole caregiver. I am very familiar with the Opportunity Council and the Bellingham Housing Authority, which supports low-income individuals. I have experienced and seen the effects of how poverty specifically impacts frontline communities and their access to climate-conscious ways of living, and surviving day to day (waste management, access to public services, and more).

While I was homeless I had formed many connections with frontline community members, as well as services that supported us. I have attended meetings alongside my grandma, as both her interpreter and case manager (she is both disabled and has dyslexia). Often I have spoke with students and young adults at Bellingham's Northwest Youth Services, for youths 13-24. I am very familiar with communities of color, Hispanic/Latino community members, people of low-income, and those with disabilities.

I have never attended a meeting or served on a board, or committee. However I am currently taking a class on Environmental Social Issues where we will be attending a public meeting this semester.
