Hazard Mitigation Plan Workgroup – Meeting 9

1. Welcome and Introductions	Members typed their names and affiliations into the chat (see attendance below).
2. Thurston County Risk Assessment; Rob Flaner, Tetra Tech	<p>Rob Flaner introduced the importance of a Hazard Mitigation Plan Risk Assessment and its role in informing mitigation strategies. Flaner provided an overview of the Phase One Risk Assessment Loss Matrices, which were generated from building stock data. The matrices estimate impacts on people, property, and economy from disaster scenarios and use these estimates to create hazard risk ratings. The loss matrices include HAZUS modeled risk assessment results for three flood scenarios, dam failure, and three earthquake scenarios. The matrices also include exposure risk assessment results for tsunami, landslide, volcanic lahar, and wildland fire. Flaner described how HAZUS calculates loss estimations for flood and earthquake.</p> <p>Flaner explained that Phase 2 of the Risk Assessment is forthcoming. It will include a HAZUS model loss estimation of critical facilities for flood, earthquake, and dam failure and exposure analysis for the other hazards. The critical facilities loss estimation will include both damage and functional downtown estimates. The results of the critical facilities loss estimates will provide the basis for the special purpose districts' risk assessment.</p>
3. Next Steps: Hazard Profiles, Mapping, and Annex Templates; Paul Brewster, TRPC	Paul Brewster provided a brief update on TRPC's activities to update the hazard profiles, develop jurisdiction specific maps, and produce templates for the plan partners to update their annexes.
4. Washington Department of Commerce Solar plus Storage for Resilient Communities Grant; Brandon Cheney, Thurston County Emergency Management	<p>Brandon Cheney shared information about a new grant program from Washington Department of Commerce to fund the planning and pre-design and construction of solar and backup for resiliency.</p> <p>Applications are due March 23, 2023 by 4:00 p.m. Pacific Time.
